FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra Presents Pops concert, "LSO Goes to Hollywood"

(LINCOLN, Neb. – [March 2, 2022]) Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra returns to the Lied Center for Performing Arts for their Pops Series performance, "**LSO Goes to Hollywood**" on **Saturday, March 19** at 7:30pm.

Relax and enjoy a night of movie music, performed live by Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra. Your favorite melodies from the big screen come to life as LSO, led by **Music Director Edward Polochick**, performs music from iconic films.

"I love conducting programs of film music. I suspect that it is just as much fun and satisfying for the audience member as it is for us performers! One of the great things about film music is that it spans the gamut of musical periods," says Polochick. "We will open with the ominous theme/fanfare from Kubrick's classic film *2001: A Space Odyssey*, which is actually the opening of Richard Strauss' tone poem, *Also Sprach Zarathustra*, continuing with the Waltz from Tchaikovsky's ballet, *Sleeping Beauty*, which Disney utilized in the film version of *Sleeping Beauty*, through the gloriously exciting and memorable music of John Williams; there will be something for everyone to enjoy!"

Also on this program LSO will feature **Paige Michaud**, flute. Ms. Michaud, the 2021-2022 Young Artist Competition winner, will take the stage with the first movement of François Devienne's *Concerto No. 7 in E minor* accompanied by LSO.

"I am doubly excited about this concert because it will feature this season's winner of our Young Artist Competition, Paige Michaud. I am delighted that she will be sharing her amazing virtuosic and musical talent with our audience," says Polochick.

LSO welcomes audience members to a regular main floor seating configuration, and requires that every audience member ages 12 and over provides proof of vaccination or proof of a negative test taken within the previous 72 hours, prior to being admitted to the venue.
